
Some ideas to help prepare your child for these sacraments...

- ✤ Bless each other at the end of the day

- Sacrament Prep sessions take place on Sunday Mornings from
 9:00am to 10:15 am (*the exceptions are the Retreat Days*)
- ♥ We ask that Mom or Dad (both if possible) attend with your child
- You will be with your child the entire time except for the September 21, 2014, Orientation session
- We will provide a light breakfast for you—coffee, juice, granola bars, and a baked good.
- Do you have other children that need childcare during these sessions? We would like to provide this service, however, we need to know how many children will need care. Child care is contingent upon our ability to find volunteers to do so.
- GIFT is our primary religious formation at Lourdes—please be sure you have registered. The GIFT Registration form is also the registration form for Sacrament Prep. The fee is stated on the GIFT form. Please return this form to the Parish Office NO LATER than <u>SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 7, 2014</u>.
