
Talk to your family or with someone you know about how you use your friendliness to make a new friend.

WORSHIP

Authority and Mystery

“Today’s readings present us with an interesting combination and contrast. The first reading and the Gospel tend to focus our attention on authority in the Church. In the first reading, Shebna loses his authority and Eliakim is given it. In the Gospel, Jesus promises the keys of the kingdom to Peter and speaks of binding and loosing. On the other hand, the second reading speaks with eloquence about ‘the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How inscrutable are his judgments and how unsearchable his ways! For who has known the mind of God or who has been his counselor?’ And, in the Gospel, Jesus says that Peter’s insight was revealed by God not by human knowledge.

“These passages highlight a continual tension in church life and in liturgy. Any institution needs laws and rules to function. Good liturgy needs guidelines to make sure that it remains the recognizable ritual pattern of the whole Church, not just the whims of a given community. But, in neither case are laws and rules enough. They exist in order to foster the purpose of the Church and of the liturgy, which is to connect people to the mysterious one whom we call God.

“The mission of the Church is to proclaim the good news that God loves every person and every part of creation, assuring people of the boundless mercy of God and inviting them into union with God. The liturgy cannot make such a union happen, but it is intended to create a time and space where it can happen.”

Society of Saint Vincent de Paul

St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) has been in existence for over 200 years. Its founder, Frederic Ozanam, was a college student leading a small group of his classmates into the poor areas of Paris to do what they could to assist persons in need of food and fuel. They worked one-to-one with families, giving witness to non-believers about the vitality of their faith. This model of assistance spread through Europe and arrived in our archdiocese in 1849.

SVDP assists people here in the Our Lady of Lourdes area with basic needs for food, clothing, household items, and shelter. Our parish conference is part of an international Catholic organization bringing men and women together to grow spiritually by visiting anyone in need.

September is SVDP awareness month. Perhaps known for its quiet, behind the scenes work, we want you to become more familiar with the presence of SVDP here at Lourdes. Our Vincentians continue to work quietly serving the poor in our midst.

We meet every other Tuesday at 7:00 pm, in Room 4. Come and see what we are all about. Maybe you, too, would like to devote your discipleship to SVDP.

MOMS Spirituality (Now a part of the Discipleship Institute)

There are two MOMS Spirituality Groups (one morning & one evening) to meet the needs of moms' busy schedules. The morning group meets every Thursday morning from 9:15 am - 11:00 am from September - May (excluding December). The evening group meets the 1st and 3rd Thursday of every month from 6:00 pm - 7:30 pm from September - May, then once per month during the summer.

The purpose of these groups is to attend to the spiritual needs of moms, bringing scripture readings and discussions into their daily lives. Whether you stay-at-home, work full-time, work part-time, have 1 child, 10 children, biological, adopted, or step-children, all are welcome. As a group, we support and lift each other up through the challenge of motherhood in its many forms.

The Thursday morning MOMS' Spirituality Group has been meeting for 15 years here at Our Lady of Lourdes. Some of the little ones who played in the nursery during our early sessions are now attending high school and college, yet their moms continue to attend the sessions.

What entices these moms to continue to be a part of the MOMS' Spirituality Group? Perhaps the following elements of our sessions draw them back: scripture study, prayer, child-rearing discussions, the retreat, friendship, and faith sharing.

Bible study is our main focus. Primarily, we analyze and reflect on the Gospel for the following Sunday. We reflect by discussing pertinent questions that help us to see the relevance of the Gospel message for us, as moms, in today's world.

We, also, use various forms of prayer to help us more fully engage with the gospels. We use *Ignatian Contemplation*, "composition of place," which allows us to let Our Lord speak to us through our imagination. *Lexio Divina*, "sacred prayer," is another prayer form which draws us "into a deeper relationship with God." Our opening prayer has become an important component for the group, as we share the news and needs of family and friends, and our sessions always end with the Our Father and a sign of peace.

Of course, as a moms group, our children are always an important topic of conversation. Information is shared on parenting tips. Books are recommended for parents and children. Other topics of conversation include the pros and cons of local schools, doctors, shopping, and ideas about extra-curricular activities for the children. Clothing and baby furniture have even been swapped.

The retreat: Once a year the moms take a time out over a weekend to get away from the busyness of family life to refresh themselves. Retreat leaders help guide us through self-reflection exercises and faith discussions. We also take time to play and relax with each other.

One of the greatest blessings that has come about within this group is the development of friendship, and with that has come support for each other. We support one another in the hard times and in joyful times. We are there for each other as jobs are lost and when jobs are found, as

a loved one dies or is ill and when a baby arrives, as a family experiences a crisis and when a family celebrates a special event, as a mom leaves the group for work or school and when a mom joins our group for the first time to explore her faith.




