Bill, our liturgist Chris Deily, and I felt that this visibility and participation on my part would help us all to recognize my role as spiritual and pastoral leader of OLOL. This is a change. Let us do what we can to be understanding and help each other out until this change makes sense.

Once again, I thank you for your patience, as we all adjust to this exciting new format, and I encourage your feedback and questions. Stop on by, the door is open!

God's Mercy

"The first reading this weekend reminds us that God is 'generous in forgiving.' The psalm says that God is 'gracious and merciful, slow to anger and of great kindness.' The Gospel parable highlights God's generosity and suggests the opportunity for people to repent and accept Christ, even in their last hour.

"Pope Francis has often stressed the message of God's mercy, and yet it is no secret that many Catholics today do not make much use of the sacrament of reconciliation. It may be due, at least in part, to the fact that we have tended to see the sacrament as a means of instilling guilt, rather than celebrating God's mercy. While the sacrament does speak to our sin and guilt, but is more radically about God's love and forgiveness."

Deacon Mike Chmielewski currently serves as the Director of Deacon Services for the Archdiocese as well as serving the faith community at Holy Apostles Parish, New Berlin. He was ordained to the Permanent Diaconate in 2009, and has served at Holy Apostles since his ordination. His parish ministries include marriage and baptism prep, spiritual direction for SVDP, presiding at communion services at nursing homes, as well as service at the altar. After 41 years as a therapist and mental health professional at the Carmelite Home for Boys, he assumed his current Archdiocesan role in December of 2015. If the last name is familiar, yes, he is related (brother-in-law) to our Parish Director.

Rick Cesar is a founding nurse and clinic manager at Bread of Healing Clinic. He has worked as an ER nurse, and was a parish nurse at OLOL and Cross Lutheran for many years, before initiating the clinic with Dr. Horner-Ibler.

Society of Saint Vincent de Paul

Visits to Homes, Hospitals, Nursing Homes, and Prisons

The St. Vincent de Paul Society visits people in all kinds of distress to offer a helping hand and a listening ear. Volunteers go to the homes of anyone who requests help. The home visit is the basic, most fundamental activity of the Vincentian ministry. Rather than have people come to us, we go to the homes of those in need. During this visit, we learn the nature of the problem as well as more about their other needs. Whatever the person shares with us remains **confidential** between the Vincentian conference and the person. A home visit is always done by a minimum of two Vincentians, never alone. We listen to the person or family, getting their perspective on the problem and its resolution. The information gathered at the initial visit is brought back to the SVDP meeting and discussed. It is a joint decision within our conference as to what assistance we are able to provide. One of our most important gifts to leave behind is a feeling that someone cares and that there is hope. We celebrate the works of our parish SVDP conference and encourage everyone to consider becoming part of this arm of the Church's ministry. We meet every other Tuesday in Room 3 at 7:00. Our next meeting is September 26. See you there!

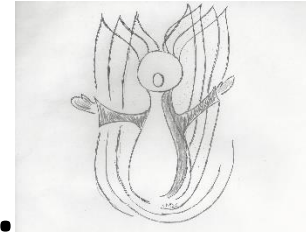

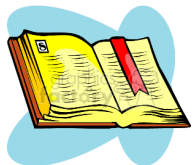
BIBLE STUDY

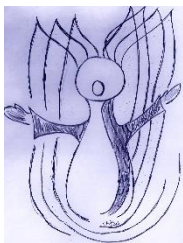
