

#### Cancellation and Closing Notifications: Television

Also, as many people are trying to enter closings at the same time to the TV outlets, the stations may not be able to refresh their crawls as quickly as we might like.

Remember that closings for OLOL on TV are up for a few seconds before they move on with other closings. This is why we encourage you to look to our other means of communication to get this info. If you do not have access to these notices, please connect with someone who does.

Above all, use common sense. If the roads are dangerous, don't go out.

#### Advent – What's the Rush?

Hurry up and wait! You know what I mean, right? We all have had times when we are in a hurry to get where we are going and end up waiting. We can be annoyed that we are wasting time and inconvenienced, oblivious to the blessing we have just received. Our plans may be altered, and we must face we are not in control. This disruption of waiting, however, may be a graced moment. This gift of time allows us to let go of control, take time to slow down, to breathe, to reflect, to be still and mindful of the moment and reconnect with our spirit and the Spirit. This waiting, might be exactly what we need at this moment in our life. Advent is the Church's time to wait and be still and to find for which we long: inner serenity and connection to the Divine.

Let us recall what Mary might have been doing during her pregnancy, as she prepared for her baby, Jesus. She could not hurry her process, and she certainly was not in control of her life. It was planned for her, and she graciously accepted. She must have cherished quiet, reflective time to prepare herself for this miracle of life. Advent invites us to follow Mary's example of slowing down and being in the moment. This season as we bring Christ to life in us and bring Christ to those around us, may we find the balance in work and rest. It is in the quiet we can best hear the Spirit whispering to us.
