EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

"If you witnessed a miracle, wouldn't you want to tell everyone? If you saw the sun dance in the sky, a crippled man walk, or the Virgin Mary appear in front of you, wouldn't you just want to shout about it from a rooftop so all could hear? Maybe you would be afraid others would not believe you. You might choose instead to keep it to yourself to avoid criticism and ridicule. At least, if you saw a miracle, you would have a choice: to tell or not to tell.

"Yet, at every Mass we witness a miracle. We witness bread and wine as it becomes the true presence of Jesus Christ. It isn't a saint or Mary appearing before us; it is actually Jesus! When was the last time you told anybody about that miracle?

"It might not be easy for us to always talk about our faith, but we can show them. When we receive the Eucharist into our bodies, we become one with Christ. We go forth from the Mass as a living testimony of the miracle that occurred at Mass. People will not be able to simply look at us and see the evidence. We need to demonstrate to them the reality of this miracle by our good deeds and profound acts of charity. That is stewardship. That is bearing witness to the truth of our God being truly present to us. It is something we should want to share with everyone."

In this parish community, we strive to give to our mission partner in Haiti as our primary means of giving alms. A required fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday is understood as refraining from meat, eating no more than two full meals (one larger and two smaller), and nothing between meals. This is asked of people in good health and not pregnant between the ages of 18 and 59. Additionally, we are asked to abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent.

But what about prayer? Certainly, we can all use a boost in our prayer lives! How about trying something new this year—have you ever considered becoming a part of our prayer ministry? To do so, kindly contact the Parish Office. You will then receive (or pick up) prayer intentions for our parish members and beyond on a weekly basis. This is a wonderful way to grow in compassion, in gratitude, and in making some quiet time a habit during Lent.

Incense Flag: "Let my prayer rise like incense before you" (Ps 141:2)

Incense has been used in prayer and rituals since ancient times as a symbol of purification and sanctification. The smoke symbolizes the prayers of the people offered up to God, expressed beautifully in Psalm 141.

In modern times, incense is used much less frequently due to the number of people who have serious allergies to smoke of any kind. Even the most non-toxic formulas seem to affect their allergies, even to the point of preventing people from attending liturgy.

In lieu of incense, we will use an "incense flag" to begin our liturgies in Lent. As the flag moves, seemingly to float through our worship space, allow your spirit and your prayers to rise with the flow of the flag in worship with the movement minister.

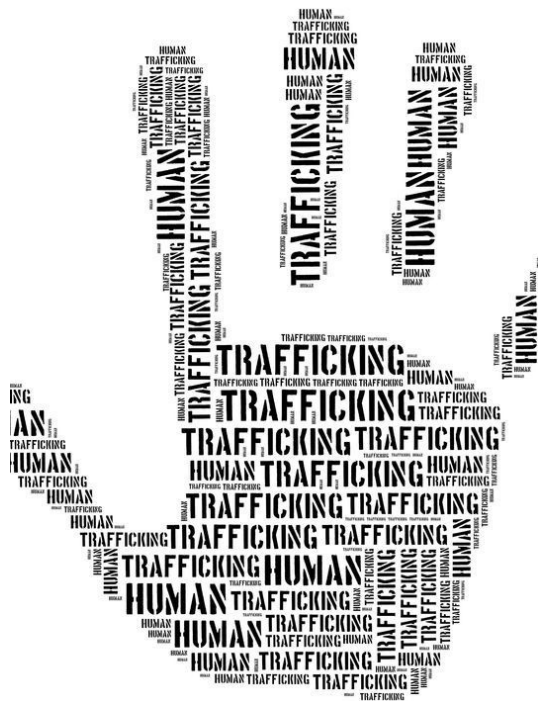
