# Discipleship Opportunities for Service 2022-2023

Each of us has been created uniquely in God's image and, therefore, bring our own set of gifts to the work of building the kingdom. Some of us are gifted with musical abilities, others the ministry of catechesis, and others are called to share their gifts through service to those on the margins. Service opportunities help us to live out our faith in the world. How are you answering the call to continue to live out the mission and ministry of Jesus?

As you consider the year ahead, I invite you to reflect upon how you are called to share your gifts with others.

## **Commitments**

Service is an important part of the preparation for Confirmation. Many of you are already doing wonderful things in the parish and around the community. We ask that, during this year of preparation for Confirmation, you continue to commit to service in **five** specific ways.

You should find **one** way to get involved in the **liturgy**. This could be as a Musician, Usher, Eucharistic Minister, Lector, Movement Minister, Children's Liturgy of the Word, or A/V support. You should choose at least one to start in August or September and continue throughout the year. If you are already involved with one of these wonderful ministries, you can absolutely continue what you are doing.

You should take advantage of at least **two** ways to be involved in **parish life**. You could help at the parish festival, volunteer at Oktoberfest, help with GIFT on the day you are not attending, be a peer leader on a retreat, or you could talk to Taylor for more opportunities.

Finally, you should find **two** ways to be involved in the **community**. You can do this through serving at a meal program, helping at a nursing home, or serving in some other way. If you are volunteering through NHS, Key Club, Scouts, or some other organization, you can talk to Taylor about counting those opportunities.

#### Reflection

An important part of service is reflecting on the work you have done. Each time you participate in a service activity, we ask you to complete a short reflection online. Submitting this reflection is how we will keep track of the great work you are doing!

Although the reflection is brief, we ask that you put time, thought, and prayer into your responses. When you describe the service opportunity, the description should give the reader an idea of what you were doing. The reflection you are asked to write should be at least one paragraph in length and can be as long as you need to fully express yourself. Questions are provided to guide your reflection, but you can write about whatever struck you as important. The following are questions you could use to guide your reflection if you need a place to start:

- What were your expectations of this experience?
- What did you learn through this opportunity?
- Why does this need exist?
- Do you have a different understanding of your community after this experience than you did when you started?
- What did you learn about living out Jesus' example?
