Sacramental Celebration

Baptisms

Baptisms are celebrated five weekends throughout the liturgical year within the context of a weekend liturgy. We look forward to being a supportive community in which the whole family grows in faith. For more information, please contact the Parish Office.

First Reconciliation

First reconciliation is prepared for and received during the second grade and is done in conjunction with preparation for the sacrament of first Eucharist. Parents and children will work together throughout the year to prepare for these sacraments. In addition, children and parents are required to be enrolled in GIFT at least the year prior to second grade. Since faith development is an ongoing journey, continued involvement in faith formation (GIFT) beyond reception of these sacraments is highly encouraged. For more information, please contact the Parish Office.

First Eucharist

First Eucharist is prepared for and received during the second grade and is done in conjunction with preparation for the sacrament of reconciliation. Parents and children will work together throughout the year to prepare for these sacraments. In addition, children and parents are required to be enrolled in GIFT at least the year prior to second grade. Since faith development is an ongoing journey, continued involvement in faith formation (GIFT) beyond reception of these sacraments is highly encouraged. For more information, please contact the Parish Office.

Confirmation

Juniors in high school or any youth at least 16 years of age who has participated in Christian formation or Catholic high school may begin preparation for this sacrament. As with all sacramental preparation programs, youth must be in formation for at least the entire year prior to the year the sacrament is celebrated. The process consists of formation sessions, service, an interview, choosing a sponsor, a two-day retreat, and a commitment to prayer and faith sharing. Confirmation is celebrated in the spring.

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is celebrated on the first Saturday of the month following the 5:00 pm liturgy. In other times of need, request anointing from the presider prior to any weekend liturgy. You may also contact the Parish Office during office hours, or the Parish Director, Nancie Chmielewski, at (414) 545-4316, Ext. 113 and we will alert a priest. Please seek this sacrament, if at all possible, while the recipient is able to be present to the ritual. Thank you.

Hospital Visitation

Because of current federal laws, hospitals no longer inform us when parishioners are admitted. Parishioners or their families need to contact the parish office by phone or e-mail so we may make a hospital visit and/or celebrate the anointing of the sick.

Christian Marriage

It is necessary to contact Parish Office at (414) 545-4316 a minimum of six months prior to the date of your wedding to make the necessary arrangements.

Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)

RCIA is the process by which a person 18 or older becomes an active member of the Catholic Church. It is for unbaptized adults, those baptized in another tradition or those baptized Catholics who have not been raised in the Catholic tradition.

Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)

This is a process for children of catechetical age (6-14) who are seeking baptism and Eucharist in the Catholic Church.

GIFT

(Generations in Faith Together)

GIFT is our parish's innovative approach to faith formation for everyone. As its name implies, the program provides an opportunity for singles, seniors, couples, and families/households to grow in faith together. The GIFT coordinators have received extremely positive feedback from participants of all ages in this program.

GIFT takes place on 12 Sundays a year from September through April or May. For households with school aged children, we expect that you will attend all sessions. For everyone else, we would love to have you present at each session as well, but you have the option of signing up for individual sessions.

The monthly gatherings include an opening activity that is an introduction to the theme of the session and breakout sessions that allow for different ages to receive religious education in a developmentally appropriate manner. *Session schedule and format is subject to change due to public health or other conditions.

GIFT Core Team

The GIFT Core Team helps to plan and evaluate each GIFT session. Some experience in planning processes and our Catholic teachings is helpful, but not necessary. A sincere desire to explore and plan for the whole community is necessary. This team meets six times between August and May.

GIFT Catechists

Adults (21 and older) are needed to teach our faith for children at the following levels: K4-K5, Gr. 1-2, Gr. 3-4, Gr. 5-6, Gr. 7-8, Gr. 9-10, and Confirmation. Lesson plans and materials for each session are provided.

Catechists are asked to work together to implement each session. Inservice training, safe environment training, and continuing education are needed. The catechist should be a person of faith actively involved in the liturgy and life of the parish.

If you enjoy working with children and youth and desire to share your faith, you are invited to call our faith formation directors for more details. The rewards are not just in heaven!

GIFT Aides

Teens and adult helpers are needed to assist the catechists with the activities and needs of the children and youth.

Discipleship Institute

The Discipleship Institute of Our Lady of Lourdes has two roles/responsibilities:

- 1. Forming disciples in the "way" of Jesus, who modeled our way of living.
- 2. Continuously nurturing Christ's disciples by having His vision, His message, and His way of life ingrained in all our daily lives.

The Discipleship Institute continues the formation process of disciples by offering programs, events, opportunities and discussions for families and adults of the parish. This includes:

On-Going Scripture Discussions

Sunday scripture readings, seasonal Scripture readings (Advent/Lent), and books of the Bible.

Book Discussions

Virtually dissect books on topical issues.

Prayer-Spirituality

Evenings of reflection, and afternoon or day-long retreats.

Parish Ambassadors

A coming together of adults who reach out to visitors, new members, their neighbors, etc. in the name of the parish.

Continuing education/formation for committee and/or council members

Planning, organizing, problem-solving, etc.

Building Bridges

Each semester we bring to light an issue facing us as disciples, "building bridges" between cultures, different ways of thinking, etc.

Stewardship

Programs featuring information and/or resources for a healthy environment such as the parish community garden (Our Common Home Community Garden under guidance of UW Extension), which can provide fruits and vegetables for our food pantry or for Octoberfest.

Theology-Faith Formation

Continuing education of the adults of the parish, provided by priests and professionals.

The Discipleship Institute works very hard to collaborate with other parish committees (listed below), to provide information and opportunities to be a disciple of Our Lady of Lourdes.

GASIC (Gay and Straight in Christ)

Gay and Straight in Christ (GASIC) welcomes, supports, and affirms LGBTQ (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer) persons, their families, friends, and those who wish to stand in solidarity with them in Christ. This ministry works to help the LGBTQ community find comfort in taking its rightful place within the Catholic community.

GASIC strives to provide the message that our community is open to all persons as a welcoming Christian community. We affirm the love of Christ for everyone and offer a place of worship for any who may have felt unwelcomed or disenfranchised in the Catholic faith. God does not discriminate. We do not discriminate.

RCIA

[The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults]

The RCIA is a process that can be characterized in this way:

"[The RCIA] is designed for adults who, after hearing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, consciously and freely seek the living God and enter the way of faith and conversion as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts. By God's help they will be strengthened spiritually during their preparation and at the proper time will receive the sacraments fruitfully."

[The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: A Pastoral Commentary, J. Michael McMahon, 19.]

There are four periods that belong to this process:

- 1. Precatechumenate—Inquiry and pondering
- 2. Catechumenate—scripture, faith sharing, catechesis
- 3. Purification/Enlightenment—intense spiritual preparation
- 4. Mystagogia—celebration of the sacraments/Easter season

The RCIA program also has opportunities for people to share their faith with the candidates:

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Inquiry Team

The Inquiry Team works with persons who are learning about possible membership in the Catholic Church. A team member shares the basics of the Catholic faith as well as invites inquirers into the faith to share their questions and understandings. The inquiry group meets weekly for about four or five sessions. Team members can be called upon whenever new inquirers come forward.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Catechumenate Team

The Catechumenate Team works with persons on Sunday mornings, sharing around the Sunday Scriptures. Team members usually facilitate sessions about once a month for the greater portion of the year. They plan the session together and invite candidates' participation. The Catechumenate Team also meets as a group about every four to six weeks to reflect on the process and continue their own formation. It is helpful if persons serve as RCIA sponsors before becoming team members.

Parish RCIA Sponsors

Any confirmed Catholic who is willing to walk with a person seeking to become a Catholic can become an RCIA sponsor. The sponsor needs to be willing to share one's faith with another and to put the candidate's needs before his/her own. Sponsors are not expected to be experts in the faith; rather, they are asked to be honest and open with their candidate as they continue to grow themselves. Sponsors are asked to come to most of the sessions, which usually coincide with the 10:30 am liturgy. This involves a commitment of up to one year.

ARISE

(Association for Religious Instruction, Special Education)

ARISE is a collaboration of seven parishes that provides quality special religious education for their parish children, teens and adults who are challenged with disabilities.

ARISE serves students who have varying degrees of learning disabilities, cognitive disabilities, and emotional disabilities, including but not limited to Down Syndrome, Fragile X Syndrome, Autism Spectrum Disorders and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder. Depending on the specific needs of the student, he/she is placed in a specialized classroom, an inclusive classroom, or a combination of these.

To date, the parishes that have joined this collaboration are St. Alphonsus, St. Augustine, St. Gregory the Great, Holy Assumption, St. James, Our Lady of Lourdes, and St. Rita.

All classes and meetings are currently held at the ARISE collaboration site, St. Gregory the Great, South 60th Street and Oklahoma Avenue. For more information or to inquire about volunteer opportunities, please contact:

Pastoral Council

The Pastoral Council is a vehicle for the parish to fulfill the pastoral mission of Jesus and the Church at Our Lady of Lourdes. It does this by developing Catholic identity, promoting evangelization, and fostering stewardship. The Council strives to build a community of disciples who recognize their baptismal calls to lives of holiness, witness, and service. The Council engages in a continuous process of pastoral planning, which takes into account the needs and priorities of its parishioners, the archdiocese, the broader community, and the world. The Council is the consultative and planning body regarding pastoral activity.

The Council is comprised of ex officio and at-large members, all of whom must be baptized, practicing Catholics, registered members of the parish, participants in the parish worship life, especially Mass and the sacraments, and at least 18 years of age.

The Council meets 10 times each year on the third Wednesday of the month. Meetings last one hour and a half.

Finance Council

Per Archdiocesan Council Norms:

The Finance Council provides advice and guidance to the Pastor or Parish Director in the administration of parish assets. The council prepares the parish budget, any budgets for extraordinary expenditures, and reviews financial statements. The council monitors the financial condition of the parish, including regular financial reviews/audits as well as the internal financial controls by following the recommendations in the audit/review. The council provides assistance in the formulation and communication of an annual financial report to the parish community as required by canon 1287.2.

The council is the consultative body in all parish financial matters.

The council is comprised 5-7 members, all of whom must be baptized, practicing Catholics, registered members of the parish, participants in the parish worship life (especially Mass and the sacraments) and at least 25 years of age. Members are selected because of their familiarity with financial matters and financial expertise.

Per the OLOL Finance Council members, we summarize our responsibilities as:

- To monitor & maintain the financial status of the parish through prudent use of its monetary resources.
- To understand & respect all groups' & committees' financial needs and help them meet their objectives.
- To communicate regularly and transparently to keep parishioners informed and to invite them to play their vital role as stewards funding the parish's ministries & mission.

The council meets 10 times each year on the fourth Tuesday of the month. Meetings last one and a half hours.

Administration

Building and Grounds Committee

The Building and Grounds Committee is responsible for the physical condition of the parish property. They are charged with the care, upkeep and improvements of the landscape and structures of our parish grounds. Human Concerns Committee

Cantors

Cantors function as the main song leader and psalmist at each liturgy. They are experienced singers who prepare independently for their ministry and are scheduled based on individual availability.

Sunday Choir

For music lovers of all ages. This group generally leads music at the 10:30 Sunday Mass. Rehearsals currently run Sept-May, 3:30-5pm on Thursday afternoons.

Small Vocal Ensembles

This is an open opportunity for creating new groups, which may include women, men, families, GIFT participants, etc. Come join us as we discover new ways to pray through song. Rehearsals will be scheduled according to the needs of each group.

Resurrection Choir

This ensemble provides music ministry for funeral liturgies. Rehearsals are held as needed throughout the year. Resurrection Choir members are "on call" for whenever their schedule permits them to serve. Instrumentalists are also welcome.

Instrumentalists

A wide variety of instrumentalists enhance the diverse musical styles used in our repertoire. Instruments can include, but are not limited to, piano, guitar, bass, percussion, violin, flute, clarinet, trumpet, and French horn. Preparation outside of liturgy is required.

Polka Mass Ensemble

Oktoberfest Artisan Fair is an annual Lourdes tradition held in mid-October, highlighting a Polka Mass at one of the liturgies. This ensemble includes a variety of singers and instrumentalists.

Sound Board Ministers

If you have a good ear for sound quality and enjoy simple technology, consider serving as a soundboard operator. Using our iPad, operators can sit in the congregation with their families, and adjust sound levels from their regular seat at Mass.

Liturgical Ministries

Liturgy is often cited as one of the "treasures" that draws people to worship at Our Lady of Lourdes: The music, preaching, rituals, and creative approach to liturgy all contribute to provide communal prayer that speaks to the heart, mind, body, and soul. As the Vatican II Document on the Sacred Liturgy states: "Liturgy is the work of the people!" The spirit of worship we experience, and treasure here would simply not be possible without the "work" of many, many hands.

Liturgy Planning Team

Members of the Liturgy Planning Team meet to prepare all seasonal, sacramental and feast day celebrations. We welcome a diversity of members and request only that you have a love of liturgy and a willingness to share your creative spirit.

Scheduling: A yearly calendar is prepared, and the team generally meets on the first Wednesday of the month from 7:00 pm - 8:30 pm.

Liturgical Art and Environment

With the various seasons comes the need to prepare our worship space to reflect the seasonal changes and celebrations. If you have a flair for art and design, please consider sharing your gifts with your parish community.

Scheduling: A flexible calendar of dates and times is prepared and available to anyone interested in participating in this ministry. These dates are also posted in the bulletin and on our website.

Lectors (Minister of the Word)

Lectors have a love for the scriptures and are at ease speaking in public. Training is provided on an individual basis.

Scheduling: Schedules are prepared four times a year and based upon your availability and preference of liturgy.

Eucharist Ministers

Eucharistic Ministers help with the distribution of the bread and wine during the Communion rite.

Training is available for everyone.

Scheduling: The tradition at our parish is to make this ministry available to everyone. For this reason, no formal schedule is prepared. This ministry is filled on a "first come, first served" basis at each liturgy.

Altar Servers

As a server you assist the presider in a variety of ways at liturgy. This ministry welcomes both male and female of "all ages," including those who have received their first Eucharist, teens, and adults.

Training is required and provided. New servers are always paired with an experience server until they are ready to serve on their own.

Scheduling: Schedules are generally prepared four times a year and based upon your availability and liturgy preference.

Sacristan-Servers for Funeral Liturgies

Responsibilities include setting up for liturgy, assisting the presider during liturgy, and putting things away afterward. Anyone, 16 years of age or older, is welcome to this ministry.

Training is provided. You would serve with an experienced minister until you are ready to serve on your own.

Scheduling: Funeral liturgies are scheduled at various times, including mornings and early evenings. You would be contacted to serve based upon your availability.

Weekend Sacristan

Sacristans prepare for liturgy. This can include opening doors, turning on lights, lighting candles, setting out bread and wine, etc. At the end of liturgy, the sacristan puts things away in readiness for the next liturgy. The sacristan generally arrives one hour before liturgy begins and remains one half hour after liturgy.

Training is provided, and new sacristans work with experienced sacristans until they feel ready to serve on their own.

Scheduling: Schedules are based upon individual availability and liturgy preference.

Sacristy Helper

If you like to work "behind the scenes," this ministry could be for you. Duties include keeping inventory of sacristy supplies, watering plants, and maintaining holy water fonts.

Training is provided.

Scheduling: The time commitment is approximately one hour per week and is based upon your personal availability.

Ministers of Hospitality (Greeter/Ushers)

This ministry offers the opportunity to greet parishioners and guests who come to worship at Our Lady of Lourdes. Hospitality ministers offer our guests the first impression of our community. People often join our parish due to the welcoming presence of our greeter-ushers. The ability to interact with people in a friendly and helpful way is a key quality for this ministry.

Training involves working with an experienced greeter-usher at any liturgy. Scheduling is worked out between the hospitality ministers for each liturgy.

Ministry of Sacred Movement

This ministry literally "embodies" prayer through movement and has a long-standing history at Our Lady of Lourdes. People of all ages and ability, male and female, are welcome to participate. Based upon your ability and desire, this ministry can include incense, banners, gestures, group movement, individual dance, and choreography.

Training and rehearsals are provided by the coordinator, Rosalita Villa. Scheduling is done according to your availability.

Liturgical Drama

There are occasions when the scriptures are presented in a dramatic form. In addition to the spoken word, music, movement and gestures, a dramatic presentation can provide a new perspective and understanding of familiar stories. This ministry invites and includes a wide variety of abilities. Some roles require memorization while others require no speaking at all. No matter your ability, people of all ages are invited to participate in this ministry. You need only bring a love of God's word and a desire to bring that love to life through drama. Training: Rehearsals are always a part of this ministry where you would be working with the drama coordinator.

Scheduling: Since drama presentations are not regularly scheduled, a call for drama ministers is made by the drama coordinator.

Liturgical Drama Coordinator

If you are a person with a drama background and are looking to use your experience and talent with our community, this ministry is for you. You would work in tandem with the director of liturgy and the Liturgy Planning Team.

Wedding Assistant

This is a great ministry for married couples as well as individuals. Responsibilities can include assisting the presider at the wedding rehearsal and wedding ceremony as needed.

Training involves working with the director of liturgy or another wedding assistant until you are confident on your own.

Scheduling: A yearly calendar of weddings is prepared, and assistants are assigned according to availability.

Liturgical Assistants

Liturgical assistants work "behind the scenes" to help with a variety of needs which can include collating Orders of Worship, preparing the worship aide using Publisher software, filing, and other supportive activities. Scheduling is very flexible and based upon your availability.

Worship Space Audio/Visual Ministry

Full, active, and conscious participation in the liturgy is a call to all of us from the *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*. We are urged to engage in the liturgy through various means that speak to all people. The A/V ministry employs technology to encounter Mass in new ways. We are looking for people who like to dabble in various forms of visual media, such as video, sound, and PowerPoint. This is a great way to be involved with the Mass and indulge your inner computer "geek" at the same time.
