You send out your Spirit to touch the hearts of all people,



## SPOTLIGHT

#### **Easter Iris**

I am ready for spring. The cycle of each season continues to amaze me.

In winter, I look at my flower garden and ponder. How can anything of worth come forth from this frozen earth? As sure as each spring appears and warms the earth, tiny, fragile shoots push their way through this hardened soil. In time, this new growth becomes stronger, and eventually buds appear and delicate petals of irises burst open. Though this cycle is predictable every spring, I still marvel at God's creation. I retrieved these resilient iris bulbs from my mother's garden over 20 years ago. They are special to me, as I feel her spirit with me. I delight each year in this circle of life and am privileged to witness God's creation in my own back yard. This nature's cycle in these simple bulbs, buried, asleep, in the earth, come forth, and rise in splendor and beauty each year in spring. For me, this is symbolic of the Easter story we celebrate each year at this time, the miracle of Christ's death, burial, and resurrection. I feel honored to witness the symbolism of Christ's resurrection so beautifully illustrated in my garden.



When these irises are in full bloom, I bring some inside to continue appreciating their beauty. This reminds me how I need to take into my heart and soul Christ's immense love and goodness, and have it truly live in me and become a part of me. Because these irises are too beautiful not to share. I often cut a stem or two and pass them on to others to enjoy. This act of giving is symbolic for me, to share, and pass on to others, God's untiring goodness and love so generously given to me by His cross and resurrection. Once again, God's creation, has given me much to contemplate. The simplicity of a spring iris awakens in me the profound Easter miracle.
