SVA—Some Stunning Information

April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM). About 1.2 million Wisconsin adults have experienced sexual violence in their lifetime.

What is Sexual Violence?

80% of victims know the person who assaulted them.

Sexual violence happens in every community and affects **all** of us. Sexual violence is a broad term defined by any type of unwanted sexual contact, including words and actions of a sexual nature against a person's will and without their consent. A perpetrator may use force, threats, power, manipulation, or coercion to commit sexual violence.

What can you do?

Below are some resources available to help support you or a loved one who may need them.

- 1. Believe and validate survivors by being open to listening to them. Learn how to support a survivor of sexual assault by using words of affirmation. "I believe you." "It wasn't your fault." "I'm sorry this happened to you." "How can I help?" "It's normal to feel (sad, angry, scared)." "This is a normal response to a traumatic experience." "What do you need most right now?"
- 2. Know and practice consent.
- 3. Be an active bystander.
- 4. Support organizations and events in your community that are working to end sexual violence.

Your awareness, kindness, and advocacy can be a source of new life for a victim.

I've been thinking about the way, when you walk down a crowded aisle, people pull in their legs to let you by. Or how strangers still say "bless you" when someone sneezes, a leftover from the Bubonic plague. "Don't die," we are saying.
