

PARISH LEADERSHIP

Trustee Nomination

Every parish in the State of Wisconsin, besides being a faith community, is also a legal corporation of Wisconsin. As such, it is subject to state corporation law, which means (among other things) it must have five trustees.

The archbishop and the vicar general of the archdiocese are ex-officio trustees in every parish of the archdiocese. The pastor/parish director of the parish is the third ex-officio trustee. The parish also has a trustee-treasurer and a trustee-secretary.

The term of Rebecca Porter, our trustee-treasurer, expires on June 30, 2023. Rebecca is willing to serve another term.

The pastor/parish director may nominate one candidate for the position. Accordingly, Nancie has nominated Rebecca Porter for the position of trusteetreasurer. Should anyone else desire nomination for this role, state law dictates that we follow this process: such a person must be an actual member of the parish, at least 25 years of age, and must receive the written support of at least 10 other adult parishioners. Nominations should be submitted to the Parish Office with the accompanying names and signatures of supporters no later than May 29, 2023. Please contact the Parish Office if you have any questions about this process.

According to state law, this notice will be published here for four weeks. Should there be other nominee(s), biographical information will be available the weekend of June 3-4 with an election held the weekend of June 10-11.

The National Eucharistic Revival: The Archdiocesan Eucharistic Congress, Corpus Christi—and a Bake Sale!

There is a lot going on when it comes to the Eucharist these days! The US Conference of Catholic Bishops is organizing a National Eucharistic Revival that looks to "renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist". This revival is a several year campaign that will formally begin with a Eucharistic Congress at the Mary Mother of God Center in Milwaukee on Saturday, June 10. All are invited to this morning of Mass, reconciliation, adoration, food, and fun. Please contact Deb Steppe for registration information for this event. The folks at the archdiocese have assured us that it will not rain that day but do have contingency plans in case the Milwaukee weather does not cooperate!

Here at Our Lady of Lourdes, we will spend much time in the next year focusing on the Eucharist in many different ways. We will look at how "Eucharist" is derived from the Greek word that means "thanksgiving." We will look at not only receiving the Eucharist at Mass but being the Eucharist—being the Body of Christ—for our world.

There will be much more to come, but in the meantime, we would like to start our heightened focus of being Christ for the world by baking bread (and other assorted goodies) and sharing "bread" with those in need. On June 10/11, the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), we will have a bake sale with the proceeds going toward our sisters and brothers in Haiti. We will have more details about the bake sale including recipes for homemade unleavened bread in the coming weeks.

An Evening with Pope Francis

In conjunction with Earth Day, a group of climate minded individuals gathered in Hall A on April 24 to view the documentary *The Letter* which is based on the teaching of *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis' encyclical on care for our common home. In response to a written invitation from Pope Francis in 2019, frontline leaders from four environmentally threatened areas of the world journeyed to Rome to meet with him.

Through personal stories, viewers learned how the planetary crisis is taking its toll on nature and people in Senegal, the Amazon, India, and Hawaii. Pope Francis commended the leaders for their efforts and voiced his concern for the poor, the Indigenous, youth, and wildlife.

After the film, viewers participated in a thought-provoking discussion. Some suggested actions were: to continue support for the parish recycling program, to write to city and church leaders urging more action on environmental concerns, and to stop the use of so many single use plastics.

The Prayer Ministry of Our Lady of Lourdes

The Prayer Ministry is just one of the amazing ministries here at OLOL. This ministry is a group of parishioners that pray for the prayer requests they receive. There is a wooden box in the lobby, on the heater, complete with paper & pens. A prayer request is written on the paper and put into that box. These requests are picked up, typed up, and distributed to the volunteers. This is done on a monthly basis. You can also put in a prayer request by using the OLOL website at <u>ololmke.org/prayer-request/</u>.

All of this is coordinated by Mary Crisp! Mary told me that her mom was her inspiration and that this ministry has helped in her own prayer life.

In 2008, there were 86 people involved. Today, there are 21 people. Interested? Contact the Parish Office and they will connect you with Mary Crisp.

Each month, you can pick up the prayer request sheet—that box is located on the lobby window. Now, how you pray—well, that's up to you. Prayer is personal and different for all of us. No matter how you do it, it works!

This was the first ministry I joined. It was a way for me to get to know other parishioners. And it has helped me in my prayer life. I like holding the list in my hand, while sitting outside with nature. Sometimes I take the list with me while I'm out walking. Being part of this ministry reminds me to be thankful for what I have!

So, think about it!

Remember – When you can't put your prayer into words, God hears your heart!
