

PARISH LEADERSHIP

Trustee Nomination

Every parish in the State of Wisconsin, besides being a faith community, is also a legal corporation of Wisconsin. As such, it is subject to state corporation law, which means (among other things) it must have five trustees.

The archbishop and the vicar general of the archdiocese are ex-officio trustees in every parish of the archdiocese. The pastor/parish director of the parish is the third ex-officio trustee. The parish also has a trustee-treasurer and a trustee-secretary.


The term of Rebecca Porter, our trustee-treasurer, expires on June 30, 2023. Rebecca is willing to serve another term.

The pastor/parish director may nominate one candidate for the position. Accordingly, Nancie has nominated Rebecca Porter for the position of trusteetreasurer. Should anyone else desire nomination for this role, state law dictates that we follow this process: such a person must be an actual member of the parish, at least 25 years of age, and must receive the written support of at least 10 other adult parishioners. Nominations should be submitted to the Parish Office with the accompanying names and signatures of supporters no later than May 29, 2023. Please contact the Parish Office if you have any questions about this process.

According to state law, this notice will be published here for four weeks. Should there be other nominee(s), biographical information will be available the weekend of June 3-4 with an election held the weekend of June 10-11.

SPOTLIGHT

Open Wide Our Hearts That all may be one John 17:21

"The Church, like the Eucharist is a mystery of unity. Both are the Body of Christ—the same body." (Henry de Lubac)

One of the last prayers of Jesus was "that all may be one," and each time we celebrate the Eucharist, we repeat that prayer of Jesus. Yet, from many of those with whom we share the unity of belief, who are members of that same body, we are physically divided.

"The most segregated hour in this nation is Sunday at 11:00 am. The first way the church can repent is to remove segregation from its own body." (Martin Luther King, Jr.)

How we as Catholic Christians, the Body of Christ, address this disunity will affirm or deny the authenticity of our prayer for unity. We have a mandate to work to secure justice, and one of the leading causes of injustice is racism. We have only to look around our churches, our neighborhoods, our workplaces to see evidence of the inequities based on race. If we need more evidence, many resources are available to us, and if we believe as Isaiah 61:8 tells us that the Lord loves justice, we will become informed regarding these injustices. We will speak out when we hear a racist remark, we will write our legislators regarding laws that limit racial equality. We will pray that divisions based on race be addressed by church and civil leaders so that one day, all will be one.

DISCIPLESHIP

Mary, Mother and Disciple

Jesus always kept his disciples on their toes. Even in His moments of solitude and silence, He was never standing still. His life was a constant march to the cross and to Resurrection.

Mary, like the other disciples, did not always understand what Jesus was doing during His earthly life. She asked questions as a good disciple does, and pondered such things in her heart as the Scriptures tell us. Mary stored up memories and trusted that God would make things clear in God's own time.
