

This year we are expanding and restructuring our ministry. We will continue to have our regular Spirit & Grace (Sunday) Choir, which meets mostly from September through May, as well as our Resurrection (funeral) Choir, which meets year-round. In addition, we have created some seasonal, event-focused groups throughout the year. Participating in these groups will require shorter time commitments than the year-round groups. My Spiritual Journey

The first time I walked into OLOL in the summer of 2013, I had not been in any church in the past ten years. I don't think that I was in any other denomination of religion in that time, either.

I was born and raised Catholic. In the past 10 years, I'd become very upset and disgusted. There were more and more and more priests being accused and convicted of sexually abusing children. This was going on all over the place. To me, there is not anything worse.

2013 was a very bad year for me. I had toxic people living with me. No matter what I did or said, they would not leave. I was very depressed and I felt like my life was unraveling. I was evicted in July of that year. This was due to the people I was associating with. This was not due to non-payment of rent.

Due to the fact of not being in a church in at least 10 years, I felt "Why not?" When I first walked into OLOL for the first time, I felt extremely welcome. I feel like I've never felt welcomed before. In any church. Ever.

OLOL is a very special place. Everyone here has helped me grow tremendously in my faith.
