Prayerful Disciples

One of the things that is very important to me as the leader of the parish is encouraging all of us to be people of prayer. We pray together at weekend liturgy so very well—and that's important, but it is also important to take some prayer time every day. I can do all sorts of wonderful things in my ministry, but if I'm not praying those wonderful things don't feel much like ministry, they feel like work.

I know it isn't always easy to find time to pray—especially when we're so busy. If you are struggling to pray or to know what to say in prayer, here is a suggestion: Help—Thanks—Wow.

The spiritual writer Anne Lamott tells us that every prayer imaginable comes down to help, thanks, or wow. So, pray for help when you are struggling (we're pretty good at that).

Take a little time to say a quick thank you when you witness an act of kindness or when you perform an act of kindness. Say thank you when you feel love, joy, or enjoy a good joke. God is the author of all goodness, so saying thanks—even a quick one—is a perfect prayer.

Wow. In this season when the trees are ablaze in color, when our nights are crisp, and the moon is so bright it casts shadows—take the time to acknowledge God's hand in the grandeur of creation. When you notice goodness arising from difficulty, and hope rising from pain, pray "wow."

May we all continue to be people of prayer.

Day of the Dead Hltar

A Parish-wide Art & Prayer Invitation presented by the OLOL Art Guild October 21–November 12, 2023

We will be creating a "Remembrance Table" in the Lobby area—a "shrine" to remember our loved ones who have died. You are invited to bring the following items to honor your dearly departed family member or friend:

- A photo of the person you wish to remember framed or free-standing.
- Any small item that is symbolic of the person.
- A small bundle of artificial or dried flowers (marigolds are traditional).
- Figures or pictures of their favorite saint, Mary, or Christ.

Other optional traditional items you may bring to add to the authenticity of the Ofrenda /Altar:

- Incense & burners (not to be burned) that symbolize pleasant scents believed to please the dead.
- Artificial fruits and vegetables that represent their favorite foods (*no real food, please!*).
- Votive candle holders (not to be lit) but as a symbol to light the way for the anticipated reunion with our dear ones. Traditionally, tall Mexican themed votives are used. You can bring battery operated votives and light them as you attend Mass or other functions at OLOL. Please turn them off when you leave if you want them to last.
- Skeleton and skull décor (no sugar skulls, please!).
- Please label your items with your name and phone number. These items should not be valuable or highly sentimental objects since the parish cannot be responsible for lost items.
- You may bring your items and place them on the memorial tables in the lobby on the weekend of October 21/22 when you come to Mass. Art Guild members will adjust items on the altar as needed. The ofrenda will be on display from that time through November 12. At that time, you are asked to remove your personal items from the tables following all weekend Masses.



Dia de los Muertos Celebration

Some Common Misconceptions

El Dia de los Muertos is not the Mexican version of Halloween. Mexicans have celebrated the Day of the Dead since 1800 B.C.



It is not scary or morbid. There are not pictures or images of dead people, ghosts, witches, or the devil.



The Day of the Dead is not a cult. This ritual has nothing to do with cults. It is a Catholic Christian ritual intermixed with folk culture. Going to Mass is an essential aspect of this celebration.



It doesn't honor death but rather our dead relatives. We welcome the opportunity to reflect upon our lives, our heritage, our ancestors, and the meaning and purpose of our own existence.



Altars or *ofrendas* are not for worshiping but for offering our love and remembering our departed family members.



It is not a sad ritual. It's a day of happiness because we will be remembering our loved ones. Although when in the graveyard, people assume an introspective attitude.



The Day of the Dead is about love not fear.



It is not a "strange" ritual. It is very similar to going to a grave and leaving flowers or stuffed animals or lighting a candle to remember the deceased.



It is not a careless or fearless confrontation of death. It is a moment to reflect upon one's life and the cycle of life and death.
