

Prayerful Disciples, Part Three—Making a Retreat

Have you ever thought about going on a retreat? A retreat is an opportunity to step away from our daily lives and open our hearts to God's Holy Spirit—free from the busy-ness of daily living. I have found that in a time of retreat, it's easier to slow down, to rest, and to listen to the whisperings of God's Spirit—whisperings that are sometimes drowned out by everyday life.

We are blessed with many opportunities for retreat in our area. The Siena Center in Racine offers guided retreats, private retreats, silent retreats, and group retreats throughout the year, including a men's retreat November 10-12.

The parish's annual women's retreat facilitated by Nancie Chmielewski, Claudia Porter and me will take place at the Siena Center January 26-28. Based on Exodus 3:1-7, the retreat is titled, "Take Off Your Shoes..." The cost of the retreat is \$270. All women of the parish are welcome, but space is limited. Registration forms can be found outside my office.

Maybe getting away to Siena Center (or the Jesuit retreat house in Oshkosh, or the Redemptorist retreat house in Oconomowoc) is just too difficult at this time, what about getting away for three minutes every day? Loyola Press (loyolapress.com) provides a 3-minute retreat you can receive in your email each day.

A Brief Reflection on the Power of Song Lyrics

Holy Now (by Peter Mayer)

Let's Talk About Grief

Many years ago, being a new member of OLOL, I stayed after the 5:00 pm liturgy for Community Sunday. At the door was a table with an individual who asked me if I would like to be a member of the Lazarus Committee. My response was "What is it? What do you do?" She explained that it was a bereavement committee that sent notes/cards to family members in our parish who have recently lost a loved one—a note after the funeral, three and six months following, one year later, and at Christmas—to help them during their first year of the grieving process. She explained that the cards/notes were provided and that I would be contacted with the name and address of the individual to whom to send the notes. I accepted and over time I began to understand the essence of grieving. All of us lose a loved one at some time or another. To know you are being prayed for and remembered is consoling, even though that person may not even know you! It was then I learned how important being "present" and "caring" really are. Sometimes it is not the words but the presence. That is one way we as a faith community help people live through the experience of loss and grief. If you hear "Lazarus Bereavement Committee" in the future, you too will know what we do, silently, behind the scenes. Would you care to join us?
