Time Does Seem to Fly

As we journey into mid-November, we are coming to the end of the Church liturgical year. Thanksgiving Day is just a week and a half away—and Advent begins in three weeks!

We will have our Thanksgiving Day Mass at 9:00 am on Thursday, November 23. As we did last year, we are inviting all who attend to participate in our bread exchange—to share a loaf of bread with another member of our parish family. You can either bake a loaf of bread (like banana, zucchini, pumpkin, or a yeast bread) or pick up a nice loaf from your favorite bakery. We ask that you enclose your name and phone number or email address so that the family who receives your loaf can thank you. This simple gesture is another beautiful way we care for one another as the Body of Christ.

This year the season of Advent is as short as it can possibly be, with Christmas Eve and the 4th Sunday of Advent being the same day! Because of this, we will adjust our Mass schedule for that weekend as follows:

A thought on the Gospel for today.

As we come to the end of the liturgical year, we are presented with scripture passages that speak to us of the end times. The Bible's images of this time are sometimes troubling; today, we have a locked door and a Bridegroom who refuses to recognize those who came unprepared for the wedding feast—hardly a reassuring image of Christ's boundless mercy! But this is not a gospel about the mechanics of our preparation—when we put it into dialogue with the other readings for today, it becomes a gospel about our longing to be with Jesus. Let us focus today on our longing for Christ's presence in our lives.
