Carrying an Unnecessary Burden

We all struggle in our lives. We all sin. We all make choices that are unwise, unhealthy, and sometimes downright hurtful. Avoid Holiday Shopping Scams

It's the holiday shopping season which means cybercriminals looking to take advantage of well intentioned people. Use these tips to help guide your online shopping to avoid scams.

- Stick to reputable retailers.
- Use a credit card for online purchases.
- Avoid impulse donations.
 Research the charity to make sure it is legit.
- Delete unsolicited messages
 about orders you never made or
 unexpected deliveries. Look up
 the retailer's phone number from
 their website if you feel you
 need to confirm or check your
 credit card statements.
- Avoid clicking links in emails. Go directly to retailer websites through a browser.

Open Wide Our Hearts Wisconsin Indigenous Peoples

In 2021, a Green Bay Press-Gazette investigation found high and disproportionate incarceration rates for Native Americans as compared with white Americans in Wisconsin. As people of faith, this should concern us.

In January 2023, a MacArthur Foundation report stated that federal oppression of Indigenous peoples has eroded Native culture, creating a lasting traumatic impact on tribal communities, such as alcohol and substance abuse. The report also found that Native youth often face conviction as adults for drug-related crimes. It recommended that rehabilitation services be culturally relevant, such as pairing a tribal elder with a youth drug offender rather than imposing a fine or jail time.

The problems in tribal communities originate from the passage of the Doctrine of Discovery, which granted European colonial powers the right to claim the new lands they discovered on behalf of Christendom. This led to the dispossession, oppression and genocide of Native peoples.

Slow Progress: On **March 30, 2023,** Pope Francis renounced the 550 -year-old Doctrine of Discovery. In regard to the Vatican announcement, Reverend Peter Bakken, justice and witness coordinator for the Wisconsin Council of Churches, stated, "We have to take costly, meaningful action to repair the damage that has been done." **On August 3, 2023,** a ground blessing took place in Tomahawk for a Native youth drug treatment center which will focus on building cultural identity. Hopefully, more actions to repair the hundreds of years of injustices will follow.
