

Also, a check dated December 31 or earlier sent through the mail, but not in our possession or in a valid postmarked envelope, and received after January 1, is a 2024 contribution. **Parishioners who want to make any contributions in person** must have them in the Parish Office by **12:00 pm (noon) on Thursday**, **December 21**, to receive credit for 2023 as the Parish Office is closed Friday, December 22, 2023 through January 2, 2024 due to carpet cleaning in the office. ### **2024 HALLWAY ART SHOW**

Once again, the Art Guild will be presenting the Hanging Art Gallery during the months of March and April. The theme for this year's exhibit will be entitled Colors of the Wind and will run from March 2 through the end of April. We will be accepting the pieces the weekend of February 10 and 11.

The rules have changed slightly as of this year. You may now enter up to four pieces. The items must be framed and suitable for hanging. No sawtooth hangers are allowed. If you have fiber or glass pieces, they do not have to be framed, but they must be set up for hanging. We ask that the participant provide a statement explaining the work (2-3 sentences is fine). There is a fee of \$15 for non-Art Guild members. If you would like to sell your art, you may put on a price or you may designate it as "Not for Sale." If you do choose to sell, we do suggest a 10%-20% commission given to the parish. You do have to be 16 or over to participate. Pickup weekend will be May 4 and 5.

If anyone is interested and would like to join the Art Guild, it is a fun and lively activity. It is a time to learn about art, find your own inspiration, try different talents, and meet friends. We cover many areas, painting, creative writing, card creations, and whatever looks interesting. You do not have to be a talented artist to join, many of us are novices, trying to find our creative selves. We have a meeting once a month and offer extra activities if you want to attend. Try it, you will really enjoy it!

(Excerpted from a reflection on "Maya Angelou and the Freedom Poetry of Advent")


#### **A Christmas Prayer**
