VIRTUE OF THE WEEK

Epiphany

Today we celebrate the wonder-filled feast of the Epiphany. We hear in our Gospel the story of the magi seeking out the newborn king of the Jews. It is a beautiful story that is depicted in all of the creches we have in our homes and churches.

Along side the beauty of this story is an important challenge from Matthew's Gospel as well. The magi were outsiders, astrologers from Persia and usually not held in high regard according to some biblical scholars. It is not the religious or political leaders who seek out Jesus, it is these outsiders.

I think it is easy to get used to listening to folks who are like us—people who practice the same religion, people who share the same political beliefs, people who share a similar ethnicity. The fact that this Gospel gives us outsiders who recognize Jesus is a challenge to us. Maybe "our side" doesn't have the whole truth. Maybe "our side" doesn't have all the answers.

May we open our hearts to the voices, even the unexpected voices, of all who proclaim the Good News.

2024 HALLWAY ART SHOW

There is a fee of \$15 for non-Art Guild members. If you would like to sell your art, you may put on a price or you may designate it as "Not for Sale." If you do choose to sell, we do suggest a 10%-20% commission given to the parish. You do have to be 16 or over to participate. Pickup weekend will be May 4 and 5.

If anyone is interested and would like to join the Art Guild, it is a fun and lively activity. It is a time to learn about art, find your own inspiration, try different talents, and meet friends. We cover many areas, painting, creative writing, card creations, and whatever looks interesting. You do not have to be a talented artist to join, many of us are novices, trying to find our creative selves. We have a meeting once a month and offer extra activities if you want to attend. Try it, you will really enjoy it!



OLOL's History
