

Some Thoughts on the Readings for Today

It is not often that we hear from the book of Job, and today's passage ends on a most somber note: "I shall not see happiness again". Job speaks with brutal yet refreshing honesty in today's first reading. He struggles to find purpose in the drudgery of everyday life. He bemoans how days and nights seem to go by with the mechanical movements of a weaver's shuttle until the thread runs out and death comes knocking. Do his laments sound familiar? Surely all of us have reasons to lament in our lives as individuals or as members of communities facing hardship. No human being is exempt from experiencing a spectrum of emotions, including anger, frustration, boredom, and other difficult emotions.

Job demonstrates the value of bringing these emotions to prayer. God can handle lamentations – in fact, Scripture is filled with such prayers. How might we as individuals and as a community practice greater honesty in prayer? Where might we need to make space for honest lamentations?

Jesus responds to prayers of lamentation, although not always in ways we hope. Today's gospel can be difficult to digest for people who prayed for healing, for themselves or for a loved one, and did not experience a cure like Simon's mother-in-law. Questions such as "why did I or my loved one have to suffer" or "why didn't Jesus answer my prayers" are the sorts of difficult, honest questions Jesus wants us to bring to him. God's ways are deeply mysterious. Jesus is not Santa or a fairy godmother. He does not make all our wishes come true exactly as we imagine. Rather, Jesus remains close to us in our times of need. He listens to the longing of our hearts and promises healing will come in time.

We are once again collecting pens, markers, mechanical pencils, and wooden pencils. The bins are in the meeting room hallway.





Constant Contact "From" Address Change

In order to stay compliant with changing industry standards,
Constant Contact, who we use to send out bulk emails for things like GIFT and electronic stewardship mailings, is changing the address domain these mailings come from.

For example, some of our emails will come from webmaster-ololmke.org@shared1.ccsend.com instead of webmaster@ololmke.org. This change does not impact everyday emails sent by staff members. Those addresses are not changing.

If you receive emails for GIFT, Discipleship Institute, Wednesday Table Reflections, or the stewardship mailing, please note this change and watch your inbox and possibly junk mail depending on your filter settings.

From the Pastoral Council

On Sunday, January 14, Steve Szymanski facilitated a GIFT session about the Synod on Synodality, asking us to discuss our responses to the question, "What is the single most important issue facing the Church today?" At our table, the issue of "relevance" came up. Our group observed that, anecdotally, it seems like people are finding other ways to have their spiritual needs met that don't always involve attending an in-person service at a physical church. Communing with nature, for example, is one such alternative.

Data backs up what we discussed. In June 2023, a Gallup poll highlighted the downtrend in church attendance across all faith groups in the U.S. since the COVID-19 pandemic hit. Since 2020, in-person church attendance is down four percent among Protestants and seven percent among Catholics, the two largest faith groups in the U.S.

How satisfied are you with the Catholic Church? The synodal process seeks Catholic's perspectives through "conversations in the Spirit" using listening, silence, prayer, and dialogue, to discern what the Holy Spirit is calling us towards as we journey together.

Pope Francis asked us all to discern to what the Spirit is calling the Church. What do you say? What can you do to improve our community here at OLOL, so that we can provide something relevant to those dissatisfied followers who both want and need the Catholic faith to be an integral part of their lives?

Come to GIFT this weekend to participate in another synodal discussion about our Catholic faith!
