What is Sacred Movement Ministry?

Like our other liturgical ministries, sacred movement adds a creative flavor to help us celebrate at Mass. It especially enriches the special nature of services like Christmas, Holy Week, Easter, Pentecost, etc. Sometimes it's a true choreographed dance, but more often, it's much simpler than that. Holy Week provides us wonderful opportunities for movement:

- Processing with the palms or a banner
- Assisting with the linens at the foot washing stations
- Stripping the altar
- Leading people to the foot of the cross
- Lighting candles at the Vigil
- Bringing in the gospel book

These simple physical gestures add so much life to our prayer. This is where you come in, as we are looking to grow our Sacred Movement Ministry. All parishioners (children, teens, adults, families, friends) are invited to participate. You do not need formal dance training or any special skills. You only need a willingness to share your faith with others. We sincerely hope you will consider getting involved, because we believe you will receive as much joy as you will give.
