CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

Today we hear the story of the Passion of Jesus. The word passion has its root in the Latin word for "suffer," yet in English, we use the word passion to mean intense emotion, love or a consuming interest in something or someone. Passion can lead us to do important work. It can just as easily lead us into foolishness. One element of the Passion narrative that captures an enduring human tendency is the release of Barabas. As humans, we are quickly carried off in the emotion of a like-minded crowd, demonizing a person or group of people and accepting what we may have once found unacceptable. It is easy, thousands of years later, to scoff at the absurdity of the crowd releasing a murderer over Jesus; however, it serves as a reminder to each of us to keep a clear head. If our passions lead us to condemn others, we need to reevaluate our motives. This might require a step back from the crowd, in whatever form that takes for us (social media being a modern crowd) to re-center our motives in God's kin-dom.

Tech Terms and Tips

Desktop computer: A computer designed to stay in a single location, that is, not portable.

Laptop computer: A portable computer.

Modem: The modem is a device that allows computers or routers to receive and send information over a cable or telephone line.

Router: A router passes information between two or more networks such as cable TV and wi-fi in a home.

Wi-Fi: This allows devices to connect to the internet wirelessly within a particular area.

Bandwidth and Broadband: Bandwidth refers to the maximum rate a computer can transfer data through a network. Broadband is the speed it takes a computer to download or upload data using an internet connection.
