NOTES FROM DEB

Immaculate Conception

Tomorrow we celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception with our holy day liturgy beginning at 12:00 pm. The Immaculate Conception is our belief that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was born without original sin.

As beautiful of a belief as that is, I think it makes it harder in some ways to relate to Mary as a human being. Her sinlessness makes her seem so different from us. Very often the depiction of Mary in popular culture shows her to be more porcelain than human. Her smile is often serene and perfect. I've seen images of Jesus laughing, but not Mary. It's easy to forget that she was as human as you and I. Mary was an unwed, pregnant teenager who struggled and worried, and who loved and laughed just as we do.

The difficult thing, I think, about a distant image of Mary is that when we see her so perfect, she becomes less of a role model for us. We lose the sense that we too are called by God to do miraculous things—miraculous things like keeping a family together during tough times, or caring for elderly parents and young children, or working two or three (!) jobs to put food on the table.

May we all share in her courage as we bring the presence of Jesus into our world.

Avoid Holiday Shopping Scams

It's the holiday shopping season which means cybercriminals looking to take advantage of well intentioned people. Use these tips to help guide your online shopping to avoid scams.

- Stick to reputable retailers.
- Use a credit card for online purchases.
- Avoid impulse donations. Research the charity to make sure it is legit.
- Delete unsolicited messages about orders you never made or unexpected deliveries. Look up the retailer's phone number from their website if you feel you need to confirm or check your credit card statements.
- Avoid clicking links in emails. Go directly to retailer websites through a browser.

Open Wide Our Hearts

Learn to do right; seek justice. Defend the oppressed. Isaiah 1:17

The Voting Rights Act (VRA) of 1965 was one of the most significant achievements of the Civil Rights Movement. Ever since its passage, efforts have been and are being made to dismantle it. One provision of the VRA required states with a history of discriminatory voting practices to submit any changes in voting laws to the federal government.

In 2013, the Supreme Court held this provision to be unconstitutional. Currently, 36 states have laws requiring photo IDs to vote. While obtaining a photo ID is an easy process for many of us, that is not true for everyone.
