

Our faith teaches us to protect the rights of everyday workers. The world tells us to be influencers. Our faith teaches us to live in solidarity.

As followers of Jesus, we work to build God's kingdom on Earth—a community not built by climbing above, but by kneeling down. Jesus replied to Pilate, "you say I am a king." On this day of the Solemnity of Christ the King, the last Sunday in Ordinary Time, let us remember the sort of king Jesus is and the kind of leader he calls us to be.
