

End of the Year Contributions

Parishioners who want to make any contributions in person must dropped them off in the Parish Office or the secure mailbox outside the 58th Street entrance by **12:00 pm (noon) on Tuesday, December 31**, to receive credit for 2024. NOTES FROM DEB

VIRTUE OF THE WEEK

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice!
Your kindness should be known to all." (Philippians 4:4-5)

As we move closer to Christmas, I'm finding myself being a bit more reminiscent in my thoughts and prayers. As I prayed with this passage from Philippians, I thought about people around the world who probably don't feel much like rejoicing. I think of our sisters and brothers in Haiti. I think of distant cousins in Ukraine and the people of Gaza, Israel, and Sudan. I also thought about my parents, and wondered what it was like for them, to hear the exhortation to rejoice when my dad was on a battleship in the Pacific during Advent 1944, when they didn't know if he'd ever make it home.

Regardless of circumstances, we rejoice. We rejoice because the Lord is near—as near to us as the love we receive. The Lord is near to all the folks we encounter when we show them we care, when we lend a hand, or when we let our kindness be known. The Lord is near when we raise our voices in song and prayer when we gather at Mass.

Yes, the Advent season is about remembering Jesus Christ's birth 2,000 years ago, and it is about waiting for the second coming, but more immediately, Advent is about realizing that the presence of Jesus is with each of us, and when we share that love with one another, our frightful world becomes a little more beautiful.

Know of my prayers for you all.
