Easter Prayer Service for Children Ages 3-6



Praying Holy Week

Passion Sunday begins what is traditionally called Holy Week. It consists of two distinct parts: Sunday through Thursday afternoon are still days of Lent. Thursday evening through Sunday evening composes the Triduum—the "Three Days," considered to be the "high holy days" of the Church. These days invite us all to deeper prayer for our world, and, more importantly, for those who will be celebrating the Easter sacraments. We are asked to join our prayers, faith, longings and hope to celebrate the Paschal mystery with our faith community and Christian communities throughout the world.

The Triduum: One continuous prayer over three days!

Holy Thursday: At this liturgy we...

- welcome the sacred oils that have been blessed by our bishop at the cathedral, to be used for sacramental use throughout the year
- remember the story of the Passover of our Jewish ancestors
- follow Jesus by the humble service of washing each other's feet
- share in Jesus' life as we share the Eucharistic meal together
- leave in solemn silence to continue the liturgy of the Triduum in prayer

Good Friday: At this liturgy we...

- remember Christ's passion and death through scripture
- venerate the cross, bringing our own passions, deaths, and gratitude to bear
- leave once again in solemn silence to continue the liturgy in prayer

The Vigil of Easter: At this liturgy we...

- hear the stories of our faith that teach us who we are and how we are to live
- gather in darkness and anticipation, as the Easter (Paschal) candle is prepared, and experience the hope and joy of Christ's Light as it spreads throughout our worship space as the Exsultet is proclaimed in song
- baptize, confirm, celebrate first Eucharist and welcome new members into the Catholic Church
- celebrate and share the Eucharistic meal together
- go forth in joy and hope to share the light of faith with the world

Easter Sunday: Liturgies will be celebrated at 8:00 am and 10:30 am

"The Most Segregated Hour"

On Friday, February 28, we at Our Lady of Lourdes were treated to an excellent presentation by the All Saints Gospel Choir of both Black and White Catholic parishioners. It was exhilarating. Just as important was the fellowship we had afterwards with All Saints members. A positive sign was that our new archbishop, Jeffrey Grob, and his mother attended the concert and stayed for the fellowship in our hall to meet and greet all who came. They stayed to the very end.

But it also reminded us of the division within our Christian communities. "11 o'clock on Sunday morning is one of the most segregated hours, if not the most segregated hour, in Christian America," Martin Luther King Jr., once said.

It is one thing to bring this choir to us. It is another for us to go to them. Events are held at other central city Catholic parishes such as St. Francis of Assisi. We can donate our time to the St. Ben's and All Saints meal programs. Seek out other opportunities to build a better understanding of people of other races and cultures perhaps through a dance or theatrical production. Even a television show might make a difference.

We all have a tendency to sit with people like ourselves rather than those different from ourselves at various functions. Don't be afraid to bond with others. Remember that we are one people, all part of the body of Christ.



Why would a church care about the environment?

- On October 4, 2023, Pope Francis released *Laudate Deum*, an unprecedented follow-up document to his *Laudato Si'*, in which he challenges us to understand that we are all connected and that in our ecological crises we have a moral obligation to care for the environment and how that affects the most poor and vulnerable among us.
- Catholic Social Teaching states that we are stewards of the earth and the creatures that inhabit it.

Our Lady of Lourdes has several ways you can take action!

Where: Jackson Park Pavillion (9:00 am–11:15 am), lunch (11:30 am at OLOL) Gloves and large trash bags provided. It's helpful if you bring a small pail or bag Registration with MKE Riverkeeper is required (link is on the sign-up page)

Action: Our Lady of Lourdes is committed to recycling and has resources here at church! Please see the opposite page for more details

Action: We need **volunteers**! We are looking for parishioners who are willing to help with Our Lady of Lourdes' commitment to recycle. Please contact the office for more information (414-545-4316)

Action: Reach out to your Wisconsin and United States representatives and advocate for laws that will help protect our environment! Here is a link on how to find out who your representatives are: https://www.house.gov/representatives/find-your-representative



We have made recycling easier for you! We have bins near the south entrance of the building where toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes, prescription bottles, pens/pencils/markers/crayons, eye glasses, and soda can tabs can be dropped off.

READ INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY:

- 1. prescription bottle bin: bottles are used by the Bread of Healing Clinic
 - ONLY prescription and vitamin bottles are accepted
 - NO LABELS or STICKY residue on bottles
 - Place bottles directly in bin (NOT in plastic bags, please)
- 2. eye glass bin: this collection is given to the Lions Club
- 3. <u>soda tab bin:</u> the tabs are collected and then money from the weighed aluminum is used by Ronald McDonald House.
- 4. <u>oral hygiene bin:</u> this collection goes to Terracycle.
 - empty toothpaste tubes
 - all types of toothbrushes
 - empty floss containers
- 5. <u>used writing utensil bin:</u> these are donated to Staples recycling program
 - pens
 - markers
 - pencils
 - crayons (must be in their own separate bag)
