Reader Beware

We all would love to assume that emails we get from people we know and trust are safe and genuine. More times than not, they are. But, then events happen that make us emotionally vulnerable to being faked out.

Sometimes it is a simple chain email forwarded between friends with a quote or a prayer credited to somebody famous, but it is fake. We have seen that a lot lately with the passing of Pope Francis. As weather related disasters ramp up over the upcoming summer, emails for aid will hit inboxes. Those are usually scams. Worst of all is when an email address of a friend or family member is spoofed and you are conned.

Always be vigilant and never be afraid to fact check.

Open Wide Our Hearts

“I, the Lord, have called you for the victory of Justice.” Isaiah 42:6

Several months ago, the Nielsen Company asked if they could hook up my TV to track the programs I watch. While installing the apparatus, they told me of a situation one of their coworkers had encountered. She was a recent hire, a middle-aged Black woman with a background in data tracking. Part of the territory assigned to her included a small Wisconsin town. Shortly before she arrived at the designated property, she was stopped by a police officer who asked her to get out of the car to explain what she was doing there. It is important for those of us who do not experience incidents like these to become aware of the pain that so many African Americans suffer. My Black friends have told me of several similar incidents. I have just finished reading a book titled *Leveling the Praying Field* by Ansel Augustine, a Black Catholic youth minister. This book provides insights into the racist treatment so many African Americans encounter and asks some thought provoking questions.

“Each of us as Catholics must acknowledge a share in the mistakes and sins of the past. We have preached the Gospel while closing our eyes to the racism it condemns. We have allowed conformity to social pressure to replace compliance with social justice.” (*Brothers and Sisters to Us*, USCCB)
