Notes from Deb Juneteenth

We celebrate Juneteenth this Friday. This is the national holiday to commemorate the end of slavery in the United States. President Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863 establishing the freedom for most of the enslaved people, but slavery was far from over.

Enslavers found the state of Texas a safe haven for slavery. Juneteenth celebrates the day federal troops arrived in Texas in 1865 to ensure all enslaved people were free. In June 2021, Congress passed a resolution establishing Juneteenth as a federal holiday and President Biden signed it into law.

Juneteenth is certainly something to celebrate and it is something as faith-filled disciples to ponder. Slavery ended over 100 years ago, but the fight for racial justice continues. We can look at the records of our elected officials. Are they enacting legislation that affirms racial justice? If not, we can speak out. We can ask ourselves, “Do I hold any prejudices?” While we all endeavor to not discriminate, sometimes we have a biased belief about a group of people who are different from us.

As Americans we strive to build a more perfect union. As Catholic Christians we work to build God’s kingdom. As we celebrate Juneteenth and work for racial justice, those two endeavors are not mutually exclusive.

Weekend Sacristan

Sacristans are a vital part of our weekend worship, as they complete many tasks to prepare our worship space. This includes lighting candles, setting out the bread and wine, preparing the items for the altar (wine cups, bread bowls, purificators), and after-liturgical clean up. If you are more of a behind-the-scenes type of personality, this is an ideal ministry for you. Training is always provided.

Ministers of Hospitality (Greeter/Usher)

This ministry offers the opportunity to greet parishioners and guests who come to worship at Our Lady of Lourdes. Many parishioners have joined our parish because of the welcoming presence of our greeters and ushers. Greeters are asked to arrive at least one half-hour before liturgy begins in order to greet people as they arrive. 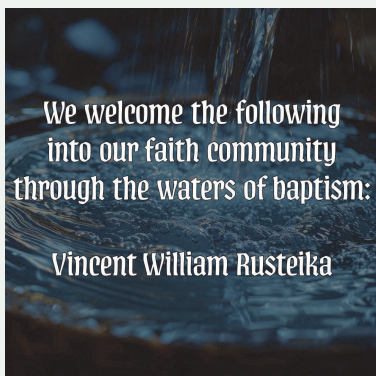

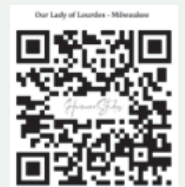
